Starting with a site with previous planning consent for an average house, our client chose to start again.

Our brief was to provide a design that both suited the village setting and that of the client, but mindful this development was intended for sale.

Planned to look as if it has developed over time this new build house was designed to look like two gabled cottages that had been joined together with an infill construction.

Whilst traditional design prevailed on the street elevation the rear elevation was developed with a more contemporary feel with plenty of glass, two large openings onto an introverted courtyard will enable the occupants to transform the kitchen and living room to open out across the courtyard

The large kitchen is fully fitted with island units and adjoining utility room. The kitchen then opens out in to a dining area that benefits from a timeless addition of an oak framed garden room.

The level of detailing was accurately carried through during the construction period and the result is a classic new build property which has excellent insulation levels and low running costs.
